The health and wellbeing of your camper is our main Priority.

First Aid Kits and personal protective equipment are readily accessible throughout the farm in 3 main locations - Main office, upper barn and lower barn

Hand sanitizer is carried by all counselors and we encourage frequent hand washing .

Our staff is also trained in the proper use of Epi- Pens

Care of Mildly Ill camper/Minor Health issues at camp(cuts, scapes, bee stings , etc) If any minor health issues arise with a camper , counselors will bring them to the camp director / health care Supervisor. We have a quiet area with a cot if a camper needs to relax until a parent is notified. Parents will be notified via their contact numbers on health care forms provided. Camp director will decide with a parent if the child should leave camp or not.

Mental Health Crisis We are not a Therapeutic Camp but your child's Mental health is important to us . If your child is experiencing a mental health crisis at camp Parents will be notified immediately. Parents will be expected to come pick up their camper right away to ensure the camper receives immediate proper care .

Emergency Health care Provisions In the event EMS services need to be called- All staff will have access to a EMS contact numbers, a phone and family contact numbers. EMS numbers , location of facility and Health care consultant numbers are displayed through out the facility

Plans for Isolation and discharge of a sick camper/staff Camper or staff members exhibiting signs of any illness will be immediately isolated in our camp office .Parents or legal guardians will be immediately contacted to come pick up the camper/ staff to leave camp. Full contact info will be kept on all camp/ staff (email , cell) with easy access. A note from a doctor will be required to return to camp. Holliston Board of Health will also be notified of Symptomatic cases.

Medication administered at camp - Medication will be stored with and administered by the Health care Supervisor.

Cleaning and sanitizing Procedures

All common areas will be cleaned throughout the camp day including but not limited to Bathrooms, picnic tables , classroom , etc. Cleaner and Paper towels will be available throughout the facility for staff to accomplish this easily.

Hygiene practices - Campers and staffed will be encouraged to wash hands frequently, before and after eating . Counselors will carry hand sanitizer spray and campers are encouraged to bring their own as well.
